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1 New dedicated support section

Previously, users (competence centres, contractors, bidders etc.) were able to submit support requests on various parts of the simap.ch. - d) the tenders submitted do not allow for economical procurement, or significantly exceed the cost framework
- e) there are sufficient indications of an unlawful agreement affecting competition between the tenderers
- f) a significant change in the goods, work or services requested becomes necessary

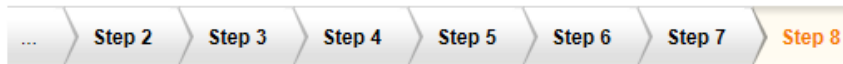
